## ISLEHAM ECO SCHOOL



Many of you are aware that the school has received its Bronze Eco School award, and is waiting to hear if the Silver award has been achieved.

With the school recycling a range of items such as old clothing, paper in the classroom (and even the staff room), bags and paper at lunch time, batteries and toner cartridges, it seemed a logical step to increase the provision within the school with the 'Terracycle' crisp recycling scheme, sponsored by Walkers, which was suggested by a parent. The parent even volunteered to organise the collection and create boxes to collect the item; well it was an exciting project to add to the list!

We now have beautifully made wooden boxes to save the packets in the lunch hall and the entrance hall of the school. We are encouraging the children to deposit their empty packets into the box after they have eaten lunch, but they are also welcome to bring in packets from home. Did you know that crisp packets are not currently recyclable in home recycling collections and therefore need to be collected separately if they are to be broken down and turned into other useful items. You can add to the collection any crisp bag of any make (including the large bag used for multipacks), including snack packets such as Skips, Quavers, Pom Bears & supermarket brands etc.

Just place the empty wrappers into one of the boxes in school. Don't forget we are also collecting and recycling used batteries in the entrance hall of the school.

Please help us to make the world a better place for the next generation by reducing, reusing and recycling!
