<u>PE</u>

- Sound the word out.
- Use the pictures for clues (the illustrations are very important for teaching children to read).
- Read ahead and come back to the tricky word. Use your understanding of the story to work out what a likely word could be.
- If your child is still unsure, help them and praise their efforts.

Help your child to be an active reader by discussing the text together. Ask probing questions and connect the story to your own life.



Amazing Animals



Welcome to the Spring term

This term we will be learning about the amazing animals in our wonderful world.

We will be journeying to Africa to discover the geography of Kenya through focusing on the main human and physical features of the country. Then we will learn about the key geographical features of the country including Kenyan wildlife, landscapes and culture. Children will learn about the similarities and differences between Kenya and the UK along with continuing to develop their geographical skills through a variety of fun and interactive activities.

In Spring 2, we will then become immersed into the world of Dinosaurs and venture through the prehistoric world. We will make some moving pictures and create our own dinosaur poems. In English we will become palaeontologists and learn about a variety of dinosaurs to write a nonchronological report.



What we are learning this term

<u>Science</u>

In Science, we will be learning about living things including humans. We will classify living things by identifying their similarities and differences. As well as this, we are going to study the lifecycles of several animals, and learn about food chains.

<u>Maths</u>

Maths will be taught daily to develop our fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills. We will be leaning a variety of skills including multiplication and division, statistics and shape.

<u>English</u>

We will be completing daily English and Phonics lessons.

We will be enjoying a range of texts including non-fiction books and websites to discover more about dinosaurs to write nonchronological reports. We will also be writing Kennings for Safari animals.

<u>Geography</u>

We are also going to be learning about African Safari, specifically looking at Kenya and investigating the amazing animals which inhabit the continent of Africa.

<u>History</u>

We are learning about the history of dinosaurs and the theories surrounding the extinction of dinosaurs. We will use what we learn in our English non-chronological reports. As well as this, we will explore the evidence which exists to show that dinosaurs roamed the earth and create our own fossils.

Art and DT

In art this term, we are learning sculpture techniques! We are going to learn about the work of 6 sculptors and the children will make their own sculptures using a variety of techniques.

In DT, we are going to make moving pictures.

<u>RE</u>

In RE this term we will learn about Christianity. We will focus on the stories Jesus told, and why Easter is important to Christians.

<u>PE</u>

In our PE lessons, we are going to be learning Dance and games using ball skills.

We will be going outdoors for PE when the weather begins to improve!

<u>PSHE</u>

We are going to be learning about economic wellbeing and financial capability. This will enable the children to understand key concepts about money and provide insights into its function and uses.

<u>Music</u>

In Music, our weekly lessons will develop our teamwork by learning the historical context of rock music. We will also be learning about the reggae style of music in the second half of term.
