

There are currently no spaces available and so we will need to look into open a new 'bubble' to accommodate more children if needed.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE FROM 8.6.20

We are looking forward to seeing the key worker children and all of the children who are attending school from Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 again next week. The school began its phased reopening to those children who had requested places in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6, as well as key worker children and invited pupils on 1st June 2020.

Please could we remind families to move along the distancing drop-off route quickly and avoid congregating near the entrance and exit at drop-off an collection times so that other families can get by without needing to walk in close proximity to others.

Also, we are CHANGING our advice about water bottles. We have trialled using disposable cups all week to avoid children having to bring in their own water bottle, but this has led to numerous spillages! So it makes sense to ask you all to please BRING IN A WATER BOTTLE which your child can keep in their space each day. THANK YOU!


