FLU VACCINATIONS

This is a reminder that in order for your child to receive the flu vaccine being offered on the 14th October in school, you must please confirm your consent by Wednesday 7th October THIS WEEK. We obviously cannot enable your child to be vaccinated without your consent.

We have been made aware that some parents are concerned that if their child develops a high temperature after having the vaccine, they won't know whether to isolate and book a test or not for Covid-19. The poster overleaf emphasises why it is important to get the flu vaccine and this link <u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/vaccinations/child-flu-vaccine/</u>

The nasal spray flu vaccine can cause a mild fever which should respond to paracetamol. Giving the child a flu vaccine means that the family is less likely to get flu so less likely to need testing and self-isolation. Therefore the key things is that a temperature following the vaccine will respond to paracetamol, whereas Covid-19 won't.





Protecting your child against flu

Flu vaccination is one of the most effective interventions to mont mas alk to your GP tice nurse or child's school you wan nation out whe how your child will be vaccinated against flu. With COVID-19 circulating it is more important than ever to ensure your children take their free flu vaccine.

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children with potentially serious complications, including bronchitis and pneumonia. The children's flu vaccine is offered annually as a nasal spray in September/October to protect young children against flu.

Which children will receive the free flu vaccine this year?

In the autumn/winter of 2020-21, the vaccine will be available free on the NHS for eligible children, including:

- Children aged two or three years old (on 31 August of current flu season)
- All primary school-aged children
 All year 7 secondary school-aged children
- Children with a health condition that
- puts them at greater risk from flu
 Children who live with someone
- who is on the NHS Shielded Patient List

Who will give

the children's flu vaccination?

- Children aged two and three years old will be given the flu vaccine by their GP surgery.
- School aged children will be given the vaccine by a nurse in the school or in a community setting.
- Children aged six months two years old who are at high risk from flu will be given the vaccine at their GP surgery.
- Children aged two 17 with long term health conditions will receive the flu jab from their school nurse or GP surgery.

reasons to vaccinate your child

- 1. Protect your child. The vaccine will help protect your child against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia
 - 2. Protect you, your family& friends. Vacchating your
 - child will help protect more vulnerable family and friends 3. No injection needed. The nasal spray is

painless and easy to have

- 4. It's better than having flu. The nasal spray helps protect against flu, has been given to millions of children worldwide and has an excellent safety record
- 5. Avoid costs. If your child gets flu, you may have to take time off work or arrange alternative childcare

What should I do?

Contact your child's GP if your child was aged two or three years old (on the 31 August of the current flu season) and you haven't heard from them by early November.

If your child is at primary school or in year 7 of secondary school, please complete the online/paper consent form that your school will send. If your child has a health condition that puts them at greater risk from flu, or lives with someone on the NHS Shielded Patient List, they are also eligible for the flu vaccine.

Time slots for booking will open <u>from Thursday 8th October at 6pm and close on Wednesday 14th October</u> <u>at 9am</u>. This is to support working parents in booking a suitable slot, who have previously struggled if time



slots are released during the working day.

Please NOTE that the appointment you book will be for <u>a telephone call to the main contact number you</u> <u>have registered with the school.</u>

If you would prefer a Zoom call, or for us to use a different telephone number to that registered, please book your slot in the usual way using the Starz e-schools online platform and then email <u>finance@isleham.cambs.sch.uk</u> A Zoom code will be sent to you prior to the meeting by your child's class teacher.

You will need your Starz Parents' online log-in to book. Please click on PARENTS' CONSULTATIONS.

(Please note that Reception parents will receive their log-in details later today)

There is a tight turnaround time on the 10 minute timeslots, so please note that the staff will need to round off their conversation with you promptly after 10 minutes in order to ready for their next call/ Zoom meeting.

The staff will have a report to talk through with you at the meeting which summarises your child's baseline data since starting back in September, and target areas to support progress. You will receive a copy of the report and any comments and notes from your child's teacher AFTER the meeting.

If your child has special educational needs and is on the SEND register, please book a longer time slot via the SEN parents' meeting link SEND PARENTS' MEETINGS and then email <u>finance@isleham.cambs.sch.uk</u> if you would prefer a Zoom meeting. (Please note that these appointments are only for those who have Assess, Plan, Do, Review documents as more time is needed to talk through the new Assess, Plan, Do, Review targets to support some children's additional needs)

CALLING CRISP CRUNCHERS

As you may be aware, the school were collecting used crisp packets in a box within the school, and had been doing so for around a year, before lockdown stopped any additions. This raised over £80 for the school, thanks to Mrs McDonald who took all the packets home, cleaned them and sorted them ready for collection by Terracycle. With Covid guidelines on cleanliness, we are no longer able to collect crisp packets in the school but we are lucky to have the support of a villager in Isleham who is willing to take on the collection role. Geoff and Geraldine of 22 Beck Road are happy for children and staff to place packets into their collection box and some of the profits will be allocated to the school. (Geoff believes that around £150 per year could be given)



Terracycle are happy to received crisp packets of all descriptions for recycling and upcycled into other products made from the plastic pellets of the used packets. As well as ALL BRANDS of standard crisp packets, you can also collect multipack outers and snacks of many sorts. EXCLUDED at the moment are: Popcorn, Pretzels, Twiglets, Pork Scratchings, Crisp Tubes and Biscuits.

By saving these packets and reusing them for other items, the planet is being protected from putting all the waste into landfill, and as Geoff and Geraldine have already collected 330kg of packets so far, that is a LOT of waste that is now something else.

Please support this Eco collection by keeping all of your old crisp packets and then taking them to Beck Road to be sent on for recycling. Thank you!


