

## SPORTS DAY 2017



We are pleased to invite all parents and carers to join us on **Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July for sports morning** at Isleham School.

This year, we have arranged for the children to compete in their year groups on separate tracks before some whole key stage races and events. Please see the layout plan overleaf so you can see where your child's track will be located on the field. (Key Stage 1 and Reception children will be supported by the House Captains and Sports Leaders from Year 6, as previously).

Each child will be racing against children in other house teams within their year group, and building up scores for their own house team. Children may wear shorts/ hat/ hair-bow or t-shirt in their house colour (Red, blue, green or yellow) or can wear their usual school PE Kit shorts and t-shirt if preferred. Please note that the PTA have sent out details of how to order an inexpensive t-shirt or sunhat in your child's house colour for just £3 each if you wish- of course this is not compulsory. If you would like to do this though, please return the form overleaf with payment by Friday this week.

There will be a presentation ceremony for the winning house team in each key stage.

Please bring a chair so you can enjoy watching the races in comfort, and please wear your trainers or suitable footwear for the parents' races which will take place just before each of the Key Stage presentation ceremonies!

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## Key Stage 2


10.30am- Key Stage 2 races on year group tracks


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On your marks, get set, GO....




