SEPTEMBER 2020 ARRANGEMENTS



We will be sending out more detailed guidance in the summer holidays prior to the return to school in September, but for now, we have outlined below some of the arrangements which are starting to take shape for the return to school for children on the 7th September (or the 8th September for new intake Reception children).

In line with the guidance for schools, we envisage the children will be grouped in class 'bubbles' when they first return to school in September- mixing of bubbles will be avoided e.g. no mixed playtimes or assemblies, and the number of adults mixing with each group will be limited in size too. Staff will remain socially distanced in the classrooms and around the school wherever possible and enable children to keep their distance from one another wherever possible too, and to practice good hygiene and regular handwashing to help avoid the transmission of the virus.

The main changes to arrangements for children who are returning to school for the first time after lockdown, will be with regard to drop-off and pick-up.

Drop-off and pick-up proposals

We have made arrangements so that all your children (with the exception of Reception class) can still be dropped off observing social distancing, between 8.45am and 9.00am, so that hopefully working parents who do not use the breakfast club can still get away to work as previously. Please note though that parents will not be permitted on the playground with their child and there will be a 'drop and go' system so that we can ensure children line up with their class group line on arrival and do not mix with other bubble groups before being sent into school by the Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher.

At collection time, there will be a one-way collection route for parents enabling them to collect their children from the playground green gates which open onto the central quiet area and pond area in school.

There will be 2 collection queues cordoned off by barriers at each collection time- one for the gate nearest the school office (Gate 1), and one for the gate nearest the Year 6 classroom door (Gate 2).

Here is our draft collection timing schedule:

It will be essential for all parents to arrive in good time to collect their child to avoid mixing of the class bubbles and/or for parents to send a <u>written message</u> permitting their Key Stage 2 child to walk home or to meet them outside the school site.

This is to ensure that everyone can remain distanced in the lines when waiting to collect their children or exit the school site. If you have more than one child, you may arrive at the collection time stipulated for the oldest child as siblings can be dismissed together (and of course siblings will already be mixing outside school). It will also be essential for parents and children to move off-site quickly at the end of the school day. To support this, we would be grateful if any scooters (or bikes) are not left on site. Our bike shelter will be closed, as dropping off and collecting bikes will delay a swift departure from the school site at the end of the school day.

Breakfast club and after-school club

Breakfast club and after-school club will run, but with reduced mixing of class groups. You will receive more detailed notice about the arrangements in place for these clubs nearer to September once your child has booked their place. Breakfast Club will run from 7.45am and after-school club with JLR Play CIC until 4.30pm or 5.15pm (latest pick-up). There will be no later pick-up possible initially in the new school year due to the enhanced cleaning arrangements needed in school.

Equipment

In order to avoid sharing of resources (& germs!) and to reduce the need for children to find multiple personal items at home-time to take home, each child will be provided with their own folder of personal equipment and will be encouraged to wash hands/ sanitise hands regularly. Regularly sanitised equipment such as pencils will be provided in the early years.

We ask that children do not bring their own equipment into school, other than a waterproof coat, book bag or folder and water bottle each day. Packed lunches will also need to be provided in a disposable bag.



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These will be thrown away in their entirety after lunch each day- this system has been successful during the phased re-opening of the school this term, and meant we have not needed to open cloakrooms. Backpacks and other bags will not be permitted in school, and should be kept at home. A hot meal or 'grab & go' cheese roll packed lunch from the kitchen staff will be available for those who wish to buy a meal, and for those entitled to free school meals (all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and those eligible in Key Stage 2) to be eaten in classrooms.

Uniform & PE arrangements

Children will be asked to wear full school uniform in September, with plain black sturdy shoes. Uniform will need to be washed at the end of each school day. We will be making use of our outdoor spaces whenever possible for play and PE sessions, as well as other outdoor learning tasks.

We would like all children to have a pair of <u>plain black jogging bottoms in September for PE days</u> which they can wear with their school jumper or fleece, <u>and trainers</u> for the full day on PE days. This will ensure PE kits are not left in school. Cloakrooms will be closed for storage.

Transition to your child's new class

Don't forget that to enable the staff to get to know the children better, your children's current teachers have set a transition task to be completed in advance of the summer holidays.... For <u>each child to write to their new teacher and tell them all about themselves. Please send these in by Friday at the latest. Your child's new teacher will be reading through and responding to the new class' submissions on Monday 20th and Tuesday 21st July.</u>


