Spellings:

We are starting everyone off with 15 words from the Year 6 Programme of Spellings and 5 words from the Y5/6 National Curriculum list.

We are aware that there may be pupils who will require different lists as the year progresses, but we would like to see how pupils get on starting afresh with new lists at the start of this new academic year.

On Mondays to Thursdays, pupils will practise 5 words a day in detail in class. Origins of the words and patterns/word families will be discussed along with any top tips to help memorise the spellings.

We encourage pupils not to solely rely on the class practice; topping up with practice at home will help pupils not only recall spellings for the test but also to use the spellings in their day-to-day written work. This level of vocabulary is needed to be embedded in written work for pupils to meet age-related expectation in writing by the end of Year 6.
