Happy New Year! Welcome back to school after the Christmas break. We have loved hearing about what you got up to. It seems like you have all had a wonderful relaxing time and are ready to get back to some fun learning!

As last term, we are continuing to teach the following days: Mrs. Sassoli will be teaching Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and Mrs. Airey on Thursday and Friday. This has worked really well, with the children knowing who teaches which subjects and when.

## What we are learning this term:

## The Stone Age

#### **English**

In English, we will be reading the book 'Stig of the Dump' by Clive King, which ties in with our Stone Age topic. We will be using this text to inspire our own writing through reports, descriptions, diary entries and writing in the same style. In Spring 2, we will be focusing on narrative poetry and writing explanation texts. Mrs Airey will be focusing on SPAG.

#### **Science**

Our Science topics this term are Electricity and then Sound. As well as understanding how electricity is used around the home, we will be constructing circuits and conducting an investigation on switches. In the Sound topic, the children will make a string telephone and investigate the best material for sound proofing.

#### **History and Geography**

We will be learning about the Stone Age in the first half term: how to survive in the stone age, Sakara Brae, Stonehenge, copper mining, hillforts and what artefacts tells us about what life was like. In Geography, children will learn about types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water in the context of the needs of early settlers.

#### **RE, PSHCE and French**

In RE, Mrs Barber will be covering the units 'What is the trinity?' and 'Why do Christians call the day Jesus died Good Friday?' In French, she will be teaching numbers, definite and indefinite articles and Easter. PSHCE will cover money and finance.

#### **Maths**

In Maths this term, Mrs Airey will be teaching various aspects of time, as well as times tables and division facts. A weekly multiplication test will take place on a Thursday. Mrs Sassoli will be teaching fractions and decimals, including equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, recognising tenths and hundredths as decimals.

#### **Art / Design Technology**

Mechanical Posters will be created in DT this term, in which the children will learn how to make levers and linkage mechanisms. In Art, we will cast forms using brown, gummed tape and investigate different designs of shoes and match these to purpose.

#### **PE and Computing**

PE this term will usually be on a Thursday and a Friday, and will either be gymnastics or outdoor ball games, depending on the weather.

In Computing, the children will produce music suitable for any purpose they choose.

#### Music

In Music, all the learning is focused around one song: 'Stop!' - a rap/song about bullying. We will learn about the interrelated dimensions of music through games, singing and composing. In Spring 2, the children will be learning to play a brass instrument, guided by our visiting music teacher Mr Wright. Your child will be provided with a brass instrument and lessons free of charge, and asked to practice at home in-between weekly lessons in order to make rapid progress.
