# What we are learning this term: The Victorians

#### **English**

To link with our Victorian topic, we will be reading Streetchild. This will give us the opportunity to write in a variety of narrative and non-narrative text types. After half term we will be reading and writing our own versions of traditional tales. The Highwayman will then be the focus of our classic narrative poetry unit.

#### **History / Geography**

We will be finding out about Queen Victoria and her family as well as the impact of many major inventions on the life of her subjects. We will also find out about workhouses, child labour and the Victorian schoolroom as well as appreciating that significant events in history has helped shape the country we have today.

#### **Art / Design Technology**

We will start by drawing and painting our own self-portraits. We will also use the work of William Morris to design some of our own patterns. Later in the term we will be cross stitch our own 'samplers' which will be turned into Christmas cards. We will use clay to mould Christmas decorations.

#### Science

We will start the term by investigating *Properties* and *Changes of Materials* which will include fair testing for particular uses of everyday object; reversible and irreversible changes and using our knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how mixtures might be separated; before moving onto *Forces* after half term.

#### **Maths**

We will begin by reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers to at least 1000000, recognising Roman numerals and rounding before going on to adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing using both mental and formal written methods. We will apply this learning by solving multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why.

#### **Music and French**

Our focus for music this term will be on exploring performances and developing listening skills. Mrs Barber will teach French lessons each Thursday focusing on: The French High Street; Time and Conversation; Questions and Answers; Days of the Week and Times of the Day.

#### **Computing and PE**

Planning our own simple computer game and creating a working prototype will be our first computing topic. We will also be doing some work on e-safety. In PE we will be doing athletics and playing Tag Rugby on Thursdays with Mr Stevens and gymnastics/dance on a Friday

#### **RE and PSHCF**

R.E this term will focus on Incarnation: we will identify Gospel and prophecy texts, using technical terms and how Christians put their beliefs about Jesus' Incarnation into practice in different ways in celebrating Christmas. Our PSHCE is 'Beginning and Belonging' where we will look at relationships, supporting each other and dealing with emotions.
