Important information

Swimming

Children will need:

- a one-piece swimming costume or trunks
- a towel
- · Goggles if needed
- a swimming hat (and a hairbrush if necessary.

PE

Children will need:

- outdoor trainers (with Velcro fastenings if possible)

Home Learning

Home learning consists of 3 parts.

- 1. Reading This needs to completed on a daily basis with your child. Please record your observations in the Home School books which need to come to school each day. It is important that the children are able to talk about what they have read so please ask them lots of questions to ensure that they have understood the text. There are some questions to support this inside the back cover of your new Home School Book.
- 2. Spellings We will send home spellings each week for the children to learn and some strategies they can use to support their learning of the weekly words. There will be opportunities in school for the children to practise before our weekly progress check.
- 3. Multiplication tables Children will be provided a multiplication sheet to complete each week. This will develop their fluency answering these questions as they look ahead to KS2.



Time Detectives





This term we will be becoming time detectives, learning about changes over time.

We will be exploring local, national and global maps, developing our understanding of navigating using an atlas to find countries. continents and oceans. We will also be making our own maps to navigate! This will help us investigate changes in our local area observing changes in human and physical features.

Alongside this, we will be exploring the history of toys and whether we would like to play with toys of the past. We will learn how toys have changed and putting them into chronological order. In addition, we will be sorting toys according to a criteria and making some Victorian toys for ourselves!

Our class assembly is on Friday 1st November at 2.45pm.

What we are learning this 55 term

Science

In Science we will be learning about the uses of everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal and paper. We will be comparing the suitability of materials and examining them for their purpose. Being friendly to the environment is very important to us in Year 2 and we will learn what we can do to reuse and recycle some of our materials

Maths

Maths will be taught daily to develop our fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills. We will be leaning a variety of skills including place value, addition and subtraction, money and multiplication and division.

English

We will be completing daily English and Phonics lessons. We will be enjoying a range of texts including a range of writing tasks around traditional tales and will be writing a nonchronological report on the creator of Lego!

Geography

We are also going to be learning about maps. We will learn how to draw and 'read' maps using their symbols and compass directions. This will help us learn how to use an atlas to find the seven continents, five oceans and where we live. Finally we will be learning about our local area and how we can look after our environment.

History

We are learning about the history of toys this term! It will begin by learning about the toys of today and will lead us to learn about the toys of the past. We will hopefully be creating a museum of old toys and sharing some we have made!



Art and DT

In art this term we are learning paint! We will be linking this to our writing about the inventor of Lego! In DT we will be working with fabric and designing and then making our own bunting using a running stitch!

In RE this term we will learn about Christianity. We will focus on how Christians believe the world was created and about the birth of Jesus in the run up to Christmas.

While the weather is still reasonable children will swim every week. In our other PE lesson we are learning about playground games and may create our own! We will also learn about games from the past. As the weather becomes cooler please ensure the children have outdoor trainers and a warm sweatshirt

PSHE

As part of the Myself and My Relationships topic in PSHE and we will be learning about how we can be good friends to others. In addition, recognising the diversity in friendship is critical and how patterns within friendships can change over time. We will focus on how we can find strategies to resolve challenging situations in friendships.

Music

In Music, our weekly lessons will develop our knowledge of Rock music and how will involve teamwork and help us understand the historical context of musical styles.
