What we are learning this term: The Romans

English

The focus for the first half of the term will be instructions for Roman catapults. We will then be looking at narrative writing using 'Escape from Pompeii' as a stimulus and writing information texts about volcanoes. After half term we will be reading 'Beowulf' and creating Saxon riddles.

History / Geography

We will be exploring the Roman World and their conquest of Britain. This will involve looking at coins, pictures, maps, roads and place names. We will also be finding out about volcanoes and how Roman Pompeii was destroyed.

Music and French

In Music as part of Young Voices 2020 we will learn around 14 songs that they will get a chance to sing in the O2 in January or February. Mrs Tait will be leading these sessions. In French, the focus will be on Spoken and written Greetings, Asking and answering questions, Giving instructions, Animals songs and stories.

Science

In Science will be looking at Magnets and Springs. We will be exploring magnets and their properties and investigating which materials are magnetic both inside and outside the classroom. Later on we will be investigating springs and their properties.

Maths

We will start with Roman numerals followed by place value. We will look at 100s, 10s and 1s and compare and order numbers to 1000. In Number we will add and subtract 3 digit numbers. We will also begin to estimate answers to calculations.

Art / Design Technology

To start the term we will be creating some Roman catapults using elastic bands and a range of materials. Later we will bake our own bread. In art we will be looking at and creating our very own mosaics to decorate our classroom. We will then be looking at a variety of British artists.

ICT and PE

We will be using Scratch to create our own simple animations. We will also be learning how to stay safe online. In PE we will be playing Tag Rugby on Tuesday afternoons. Swimming will take place on Monday mornings. Dance will be on Mondays once swimming has finished.

RE and PSHCE

R.E this term focuses on Christianity, in particular: What do Christians learn from the Creation story? Myself and My Relationships is our topic in PSHCE and we will also be exploring ways to keep safe.
