We will keep in touch with you about further opportunities for your children to re-join the school if you wish them to if and when they arise, and if we can accommodate further children attending later in the term.

Families with children registered to attend from 1.6.20 should now have now received their information pack about the re-opening arrangements. I would like to thank all the staff team for continuing to provide so well for all the children during lockdown and working so hard in preparation for the next stage of phased re-opening. Thank you too to all of you for continuing to support the children and the school from home.

Tuesday 21st July Last day of summer term- holidays start after school


Wednesday 22nd July Professional Training Day – School Closed
