STORAGE PLEA

As the new term gets underway, we are already finding that some of the children are struggling to keep track of their belongings and store them in school.

The first reason is that too many items are still <u>un-named</u> - please LABEL all your children's belongings (including socks and gloves) with their name using sew-in labels, tags or permanent pen.





The second reason is **space for storage** - PLEASE can all children <u>avoid bringing a large rucksack to school</u> in addition to their PE drawstring bag, coat, book bag and lunch/snack box/bag & water bottle. There is simply not enough space in the cloakrooms and on your child's peg for a large rucksack with extra belongings as well as each child's PE bag and coat, and therefore items are ending up unnecessarily on the floor and becoming lost.



All children should have a bookbag / book sleeve which is taken into the classroom and taken home each evening. Lunch boxes and small lunch bags / pots can also be stored <u>on the shelves above or beside the coat pegs</u> and also taken home each evening.

If you would like youir child to have a bag to carry their possessions home in, a drawstring bag or soft bag is far preferable to a large rigid rucksack which sticks out and stops them being able to hang their coat over.

Year 5- Tillie for demonstrating excellent column addition and subtraction skills


