## English 1 - SPaG

SPaG Mat 6 - choose whether to have a go at 1-star, 2-star or 3-star sheet.
Answer on the sheet or in your exercise book then use the answer sheets at the end of the pdf to check how you got on.
If you are stuck on remembering what a term means, don't forget to look it up in your SPaG Study Book! If you have struggled on a particular question, perhaps ask a parent to write some more similar questions to help you feel more confident.

## English 2 - Reading Comprehension - Throwing a Tree (we're back to poetry this week)

Use the 'Reading Booklet' to read the text (if possible, print this out so you can look at it regularly when answering the questions).
Use the 'Answer Booklet' to answer questions 13-25 (which are linked to this text). These can be answered in your exercise book.
Use the 'Mark Scheme' to mark your answers - be critical! If your answer has not been as specific as the mark scheme sets out, do not accept your answer. Remember, when answering reading comprehensions, you MUST cite specific evidence from the text - do not put it in your own words (unless it asks you to do so).

## English 3 - 'The Explorer'

Continue reading our class novel.
Page 384 - p402
'Another Kind of Exploring', 'Epilogue' and 'Author's Notes'. There's also an extract of another book written by Katherine Rundell that might provide you with an idea of a book to read over the Summer
Maths 1 - NRich Challenge - Reach 100
Read the instructions on the pdf and try to solve the challenge.

## Maths 2 - Times-tables

Use 'Times Table Tests Booklet' to have a go at Tests 11 and 12.
These can easily be answered in your exercise book so please don't print off.
You'll see that the first 4 questions in each test do not have a question attached - that's so an adult can ask you 4 basic times-table questions as a warm-up eg. $7 \times 9$ or $8 \times 12$ etc. The adult will need to provide the answers for you to be able to mark these!
Questions 5-20 are NOT meant to be done in your head so please, please, please make jottings and use formal methods to work out the answers.
There are examples of long multiplication and long division in your SATs Study Book but there are also lots of fantastic video explanations online. I personally like:

## Maths 3 - Input and follow-up task

Read through the 'Maths 3 - Input - Formulae Word Problems (preferably with an adult so you can discuss it). Have a go at the follow-up tasks.
Aim to complete the 1-star and 2-star sheet with the 3-star sheet acting as an extension if you would like one. These sheets do not need to be printed off - you can record answers in your exercise book.

## Foundation Subject - History ( 6 of 6 lessons)

Read through the 'Foundation Subject - History - Maya Foods' pdf.
This week, you have the opportunity to use your cooking skills.
Use the attached pdf recipes to make Maya Corn Tortillas and Maya Hot Chocolate!

## Foundation Subject - Science ( 6 of 6 lessons)

Read through 'Foundation Subject - Science - Impact of Drugs and Alcohol' If you covered the PSHE Drugs' unit a few weeks ago, this will be revision.
Once you've read the information, have a look at the scenarios (there are 6 in total). What advice would you give to individuals in each scenario? Feel free to act these out as role plays with members of your family.

## Foundation Subject - Art (2 of 2 lessons)

Read through the 'Foundation Subject - Art - Dream Catcher' pdf.
Have a go at making a dream catcher using household objects. All you need is a 'hoop', string/wool and decorations.
