GOLDEN MILE AT ISLEHAM

The school has relaunched the Golden Mile this week in an assembly linked to the overall school star value of 'Promoting health'. The children were very excited to be holding a running/walking session in lesson time each week where they can build the number of circuits covered and claim certificates. The class teacher will arrange a time (only 10 or 15 minutes) each week to take the children outside to complete a number of laps. They don't need to change their shoes or clothing (which is why we always ask for sensible footwear for all times in school) as this is a quick fitness break. There are set milestones to reach, which quickly build up, when certificates are presented. Mrs Deacon will collate all laps covered and prepare the certificates for presentation at the Star of the Week assembly.

The children all know that any park run miles will also be counted, so well done to: Abigail in Year 5, Evans in Year 4, Freya M. in Year 4, and Elsa in Year 3 who all completed 3 miles this weekend at Soham. It was wonderful to see so many friendly faces, and they were all excellent ambassadors for the school!

Look out next term for more opportunities to run/walk with your child each morning and one night after school to build the number of laps covered and to provide you with the opportunity to include some regular healthy exercise into family time, as well as spending some quality time with your children!

BEHAVIOUR POLICY UPDATED

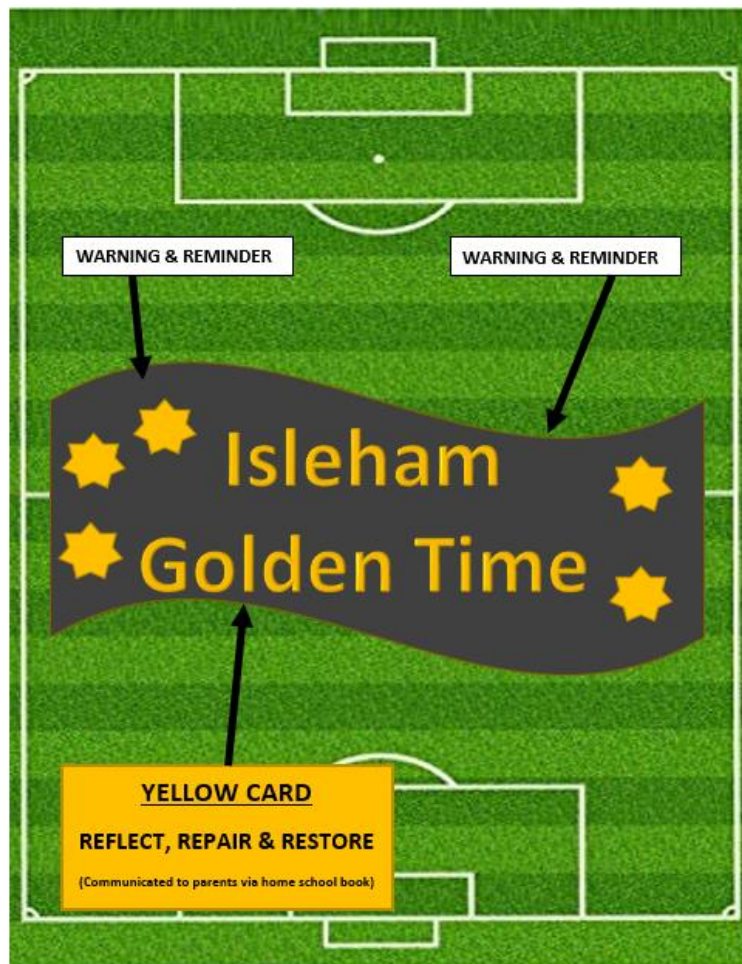
Thank you for your comments about the Dojo behaviour reward system. We are relaunching our behaviour policy this week with the children as a result of all the children, staff and parent comments made, and have made the decision that we will no longer be using the Dojo system for rewards and sanctions in our school.

Please see our updated Behaviour policy online on our website in the 'Key Information' 'Policies and Procedures' section (the 2020 update is at the bottom of the page).

Our new policy is based upon spotting children 'getting it right' and behaving positively- recognising, praising and rewarding those who are behaving well at all times in line with our golden rules. We know that at Isleham almost all of our children fit into this category of 'getting it right' and we want them to all feel valued and recognised. **We are moving our Golden Time to Friday afternoon in order to celebrate with children in their class free choice 'Golden Time' all the great work and behaviour we see.**



We have also developed the Isleham Behaviour 'Pitch' to show you how we will aim to respond on the occasions when reminders may need to be given to help children behave in a positive way. Our behaviour response aims to understand why any antisocial behaviour is happening and give children multiple opportunities to understand what they need to do differently to succeed. We want all children to be part of the **class free choice and Golden Time** on a Friday afternoon which they help to plan each week, so warnings and reminders are intended to enable that to happen. Staff will give at least 2 reminders to help children succeed, and we envisage every child being successful in gaining their Golden Time with this support.



Our new policy also explains what happens when children repeatedly break the rules (after warnings) or whose behaviour is significantly impacting others. They will receive a protective consequence in the form of a **Yellow card** - time will be given for them to reflect upon and discuss what has

happened with an adult and how this is impacting others, but the key message is that they can still get back on the pitch for golden time. Parents will be made aware of any yellow cards via a brief note in the home-school book but can be assured that the issue has been resolved in school and the child has discussed how to avoid any recurrence.

In the very rare instance that a child should receive 2 yellow cards in a week, this is the ideal time for parents to talk through with their child how they can help them to avoid any further yellow cards. Children whose behaviour is serious and leaves the safety or wellbeing of themselves or others at risk, or whose behaviour has repeatedly resulted in 3 or more yellow cards in a week, will receive a **red card**. Parents in this situation will be contacted by the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher to set up a behaviour support plan or risk management plan for their child to help them get back on track.

Please see the 2020 draft behaviour policy for more details. The next Full Governors' Meeting on the 29th January 2020 will be the opportunity for us to make any needed amendments and formally adopt our new policy.
